

## English

There will be a range of fiction, poetry and non-fiction units through the term. Some of the key themes will be:

**Fiction:** Creative writing and story structures; historical settings.

**Non-Fiction:** Reports, fact-files, information texts.

**Poetry:** Poetry inspired people and places around the world.

The class Guided Reading text is:

**The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane.**

### Philosophy for Children (P4C)

The children will tackle philosophical questions through oral debate and discussion.

## Science: Light

The children will be taught to:

- recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light
- notice that light is reflected from surfaces
- recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes
- recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object
- find patterns in the way that the size of shadows change.

## PPA – Wednesday afternoon

Every Wednesday afternoon the children will be taught by Mrs Nettell and Mrs Bradley. (This is my non-contact time)

They will be taught art, music and design during this time – with a focus on observational sketches of trees, venturing to a range of settings around Bath.

## Computing
